## GLHQG 2006-2007 Challenge Quilt

### Quilts From the Kansas City Star

The Kansas City Star newspaper printed quilt patterns over a thirty-three year period beginning in September 1928. The paper was mailed every Wednesday to an eight state area including Kansas, Nebraska, Iowa, Missouri, Arkansas, Texas, Oklahoma and Colorado. It is estimated that over a thousand patterns were printed over the period.

This years challenge **features 6 quilt blocks** printed in the Kansas City Star and you **MUST** include: One of the Challenge Blocks **OR** All six of the Challenge Blocks **OR** Any combination in between.

It is totally up to you. You may add appliqué, embellishments or beads and use any technique; at least one of the quilt blocks below must be included.

The blocks can be any size and set in any way you like. All quilts must be quilted. Additionally you can use the block patterns to make a wearable such as a vest or jacket. There are several resources for the blocks and patterns and they are listed under each block below.

#### Quilt Requirements:

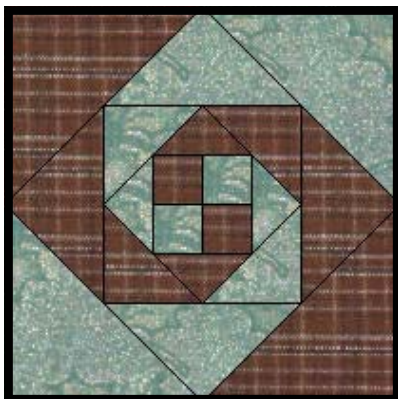
Each Quilt must include **at least one of the blocks below**. The minimum size of the quilt must be 30" x 30" but there is no maximum limit. Wearable must be a vest or a jacket.

Each quilt must include **at least one fabric that contains a stripe**. This can be anywhere on the quilt, the borders or the binding. The stripe can be of any size and appear in any amount.

**Quilts are due at the June 2007 meeting.** There will be 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes awarded so get started today. The only quilt that has no chance of winning is the one you don't enter.

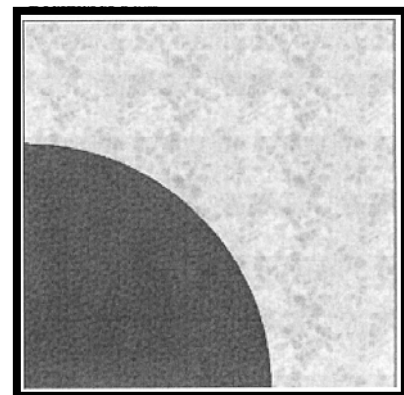

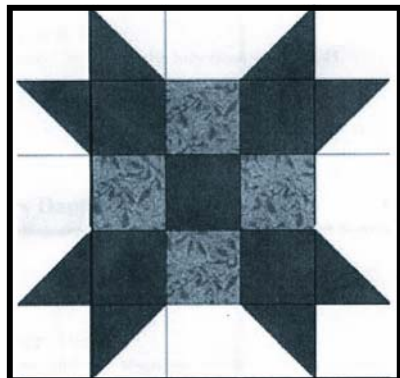

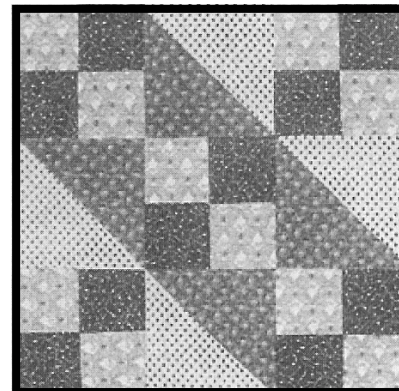

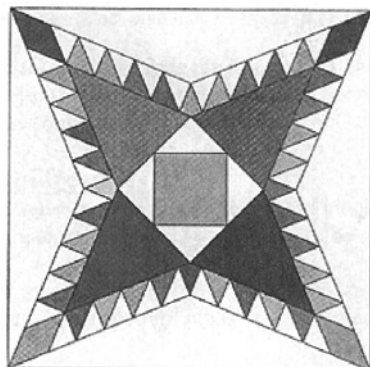
## Jacobs Ladder (also known as Un- derground Railroad) 1934

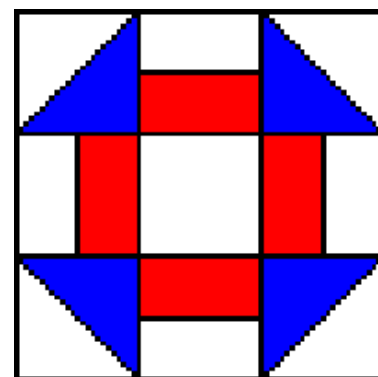

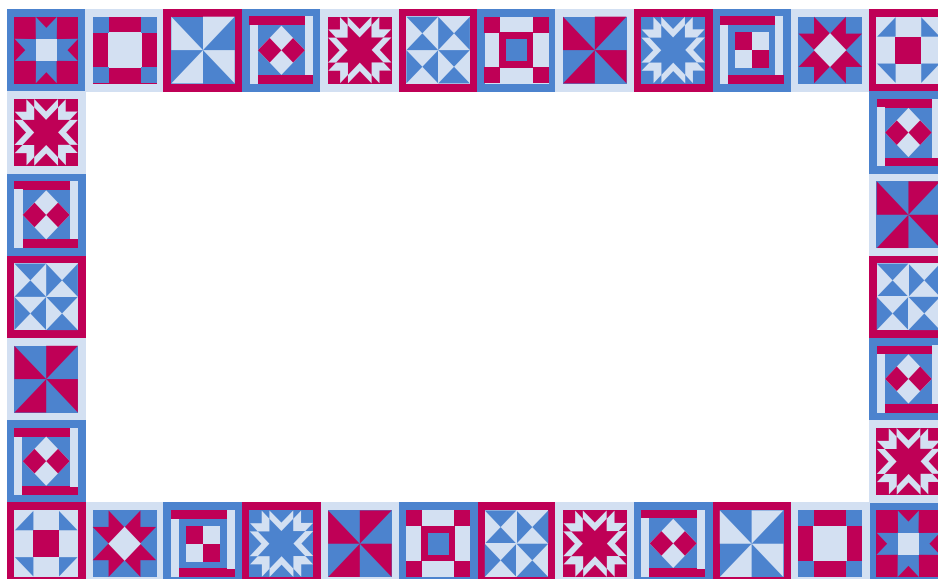
