Hi everybody and welcome to a great year of quilting fun. In September, we will have two activities for your program pleasure. "Will Sew for Fabric" is back again by popular demand. It goes like this. If you'd like to participate, bring an unfinished quilt project to the meeting that you can finish by June. Put it out on display with a pledge form (space and form will be provided) so that members can pledge fat quarters as an incentive for you to finish your quilt or quilts on time.

If you complete your project by the June meeting, the pledges are yours. If not, oh well, they go to someone else!

Concurrently, we will have a fabric swap. It goes like this: go through your stash and select some fabric you would like to trade. Measure it and record it's size and condition on a scrap of paper. For example, "1/2 yard less a corner". Then staple this securely to the selvage. For neatness sake fold the fabric so that any cutouts are visible and go swap! Please take no more fabric than you bring. The leftovers will be donated to charity. I hope everyone enjoys this free activity and goes home with a treasure!

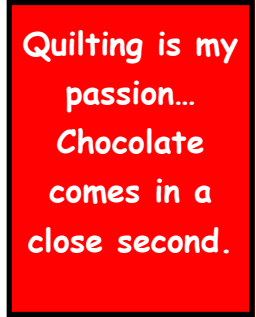
